

SERVING ELDERS IN TRIBAL COMMUNITIES

The Inter Tribal Council of Arizona, Inc., Area Agency on Aging Region 8

(ITCA-AAA) is a designated "Agency" under the guidelines of the Older Americans Act of 1965. The Agency works with member Tribes of ITCA to deliver needed services to elders in Arizona.

What services are available?

Since 1979, the Area Agency on Aging Region 8 continues to coordinate the delivery of these core services:

- Advocacy speaking on issues that affect elder's lives and the lives of others at the local, state, and national level
- Family Caregiver Support Services
- Health Promotion & Disease
 Prevention
- Independent Living Support Services
- Long Term Care Ombudsman Support
- Nutrition Services
- Program Development supporting
 Tribes to develop new programs or expand existing programs that benefit elders
- Public Benefits Education & Assistance
- Supportive Services



Who is eligible for services?

- Adults age 55 and older
- Persons with disabilities
- Unpaid caregivers

Additional eligibility requirements may vary by program. Client contributions are encouraged and are vital for the continuation of programs and services.
