Quick Overview of Common Nouns and Proper Nouns

What is the difference between a common noun and a proper noun?

- A common *noun* is ANY non-specific person, place, or thing.
 - Common noun: The <u>festival</u> is sponsored by the <u>city</u>.
 - o Proper noun: The 38th Annual Renaissance Festival is sponsored by Phoenix.
- A proper noun is a particular person, place, or thing that is usually a one-of-a-kind item.
- **Proper nouns** are capitalized regardless of its position in a sentence.
- Names are always considered <u>proper nouns</u>.
 - o Proper noun: I took <u>Professor Palmer</u>'s <u>classes</u> all four years of <u>college</u>.
 - o Proper noun: We went to <u>Hoover Dam</u> for the 4th of July.

When should I consider "Tribe" or "Tribal" a proper noun?

- Tribe is capitalized when referencing a specific tribe.
 - o Capitalize: Pascua Yaqui **T**ribe
 - o Capitalize: "The Ute Indian **T**ribe will to give their recommendation to **T**ribal Council."
 - Capitalize: "The Tribe should consider participating in this program because x, y, and z."
- Tribe is also capitalized when mentioning Tribal governments or Tribal leaders
 - o Correct: "Tribal Chairman, (insert name here), introduced..."

When should I consider "tribe" or "tribal" a common noun?

- Consider tribe a common noun when not referring to a specific tribe or when you are not referencing back to a specific tribe.
- Tribe is a common noun when it is used like any other common noun.
 - Lowercase: "Projects on tribal lands are..."
 - There are many lands that are considered tribal and it does not focus on a specific tribe's land; therefore, this is a common noun.
 - Lowercase: "The tribal perspective..."
 - No reference to a specific tribe's perspective; therefore, this is a common noun.
 - o Lowercase: "For all projects on the reservation, tribal and federal..."
 - This example mentions all projects and doesn't specify a certain tribal or federal program; therefore, this is a common noun.

Some rules to follow when deciding whether to capitalize tribes:

- Be mindful of how you are using a noun.
 - Usage will determine if it is a proper noun or common noun.
- Similarly, the usage of your noun will determine how you are using the word **T**ribes or **t**ribes.
