THE TRAINING COURSE:

The Inter Tribal Council of Arizona, Inc. (ITCA) is pleased to offer the **Safe Drinking Water Act** (**SDWA**) Federal Regulations Training Course. The course offers over 36 hours of training and is designed to enhance the skills and knowledge of Tribal drinking water utilities personnel.

During the second part of this training course, optional certification exam sessions will be offered for free to allow eligible applicants to take the **Federal Regulations** (**FedReg**) **Exam Modules**, which are now required for drinking water operator certification through the ITCA National Tribal Operator Certification Program. <u>Attendees that are only interested in the training may choose not to take the certification exams</u>.

Students will learn how to find federal SDWA rules, regulations, and supporting documents, as well as how to use and apply them to Tribal water utility scenarios. Subjects covered in this training course will include: Regulatory framework; overview of the various SDWA rules (including the Revised Lead & Copper, Revised Total Coliform, Groundwater, Surface Water, Disinfection Byproducts, Arsenic, and Public Notice rules); maintaining disinfection residual; sample locations and sample plans; compliance monitoring and sampling requirements; interpreting and reporting sample results; maintaining mandatory records; consumer confidence report and public notifications; and significant deficiencies and triggered assessments.

Electronic Tablets containing federal SDWA references and guides will be mailed to registrants that are accepted into this course. Students are encouraged to keep the Electronic Tablets for use on the job and to assist in their duties as a Tribal drinking water utilities professional.

INSTRUCTOR:

ITCA has contracted with subject-matter expert Ms. Nicole Mangin, of MEC TECH Services, Inc., to instruct this training course. Ms. Mangin has extensive experience in the operations, maintenance, and regulatory compliance of Tribal drinking water distribution systems and treatment facilities.

Course Prerequisites

- <u>New Student Orientation Meeting</u>. To be sure everyone is ready for the first day of class, ITCA and MEC TECH Services have set up a new student **orientation meeting** to be completed before the first class session. This will be a brief, one-on-one, on-line meeting between the student and the instructor. During the one-on-one meeting, the student will receive a guided tutorial on how to set up a profile on the learning management system and assess the student's needs for the course. Registrants that are accepted into the course will be contacted for scheduling of the one-on-one meeting.
- <u>Computer Microphone & Camera</u>. This course requires that students use a computer **microphone** (headset is preferred) and a **web camera** to enable interaction and participation in group activities. It is important to have these items for the start of class. ITCA offers both a headset and web camera for FREE to registrants that are accepted into this course. During registration, please specify if any of these items are needed.

ATTENDANCE & CONTACT HOURS:

Attendees that complete the course requirements will receive written recognition of earned training contact hours based on class participation, attendance, and training course task assignments. Training contact hours may be accepted towards the training requirements for new certification or as Professional Development Hour (PDH) / continuing education credit towards the renewal of existing certification. Confirmed registrants that are interested in only earning training contact hours may attend as many of the class sessions as needed.

Training course size is limited and offers Priority Registration for Tribal utilities located in the USEPA Region 9 geographic area (including AZ, CA, and NV). A General Admission Waiting List Registration is available for Tribal utilities located outside of the Region 9 geographic area. Registrants that are accepted into the training course will receive written confirmation of a reserved seat. Please Note: a reserved seat does not apply to the exam sessions. Separate written approval is required to be admitted into the certification exam sessions (see below).

ITCA PROGRAM OBJECTIVE:

The National Tribal Water and Wastewater Operator Certification Program at ITCA serves to meet the needs of system operators working on Tribal lands and to provide a jurisdictionally correct alternative to state certification programs. The ITCA is a U.S. EPA-approved provider of certification services under the U.S. EPA Tribal Drinking Water Operator Certification Program Guidelines and makes its services available to all Tribal water and wastewater utilities personnel working in Indian Country. ITCA-issued certification in drinking water or wastewater is deemed equivalent and accepted through reciprocity (exam waiver) by numerous states. Tribal operator certification is an additional way by which Tribal governments can exercise their sovereignty and promote their self-determination goals.

EXAMINATION & CERTIFICATION: Exam Application Deadline is April 4, 2024

Water utilities personnel operating systems located on federal trust Tribal lands (Indian reservations) may apply for ITCA operator certification and take the operator certification exams for free. ITCA staff will be available during the training event to proctor paper-booklet certification exams (both the Federal Regulatory Exam Module and the ABC/WPI Standardized Exam) to <u>eligible</u> Tribal utilities personnel seeking drinking water operator certification. <u>Participants must have prior written approval from ITCA to</u>

<u>be admitted into the examination sessions.</u> Approval is based upon submittal of a completed ITCA *Application for New (Drinking Water) Certification* by close of business on **Thursday, April 4, 2024**. Please refer to the ITCA Application Booklet for complete certification eligibility criteria and the application, which is available on the ITCA website or by directly contacting the ITCA Tribal Water Systems Department. You are highly encouraged to submit an application as soon as possible.

ITCA drinking water operator certification requires two exams—the **FedReg Exam Module** AND the Standardized Exam. The FedReg exam has been uniquely developed to utilize an "open book" format. ITCA will provide to each student an electronic tablet containing the federal regulatory reference documents pre-loaded for examinees to look up as they are taking the Federal Regulations exams. <u>This course teaches students to use these tablets in preparation for these exams.</u>

Please Note: ITCA does NOT "teach to the certification exams." Students intending to take one or more operator certification exams during this training course are encouraged to review the applicable **Need-to-Know Criteria** Documentation and the referenced documents recommended for study in association with the particular certification exams.

Paper-Booklet Operator Certification Exam Sessions

The following two (2) paper-booklet certification exam sessions will take place during the in-person Part 2 of the training event for those interested in earning drinking water operator certification through the ITCA National Tribal Operator Certification Program.

- <u>Morning Exam Session FedReg Exams</u>. On Friday, April 12, 2024, starting promptly at 9:00 a.m. and concluding at or before 11:30 a.m., the Federal Regulations (FedReg) Exam Modules will be administered to interested and eligible Tribal utilities personnel. The following two (2) types of exams will be offered during the morning exam session. During this session, a person may take only one exam.
 - Federal Regulations Exam Module for Water DISTRIBUTION Operator Certification
 - Federal Regulations Exam Module for Water TREATMENT Operator Certification
- <u>Afternoon Exam Session Various Types of Exams</u>. On Friday, April 12, 2024, starting promptly at 1:00 p.m. and concluding at or before 5:00 p.m., the Federal Regulations (FedReg) Exam Modules will be administered to interested and eligible Tribal utilities personnel. Additionally, for convenience purposes, the Standardized ABC/WPI Exam (current edition) for Water Distribution or Water Treatment operator certification can be administered to interested and eligible Tribal utilities personnel. The Standardized Exams are closed-book exams. Please note that this SDWA Federal Regulations Training Course helps prepare individuals for the FedReg Exam Modules but does NOT prepare individuals for the Standardized Exams, as those are subjects covered in different certification preparatory courses</u>. The following types of exams will be offered during the afternoon exam session. During this session, a person may take only one exam.
 - o Federal Regulations Exam Module for Water DISTRIBUTION Operator Certification
 - Federal Regulations Exam Module for Water TREATMENT Operator Certification
 - Water Distribution Standardized Operator Certification Exams (levels 1 through 4 available)
 - Water Treatment Standardized Operator Certification Exams (levels 1 through 4 available)

TRAVEL EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT STIPENDS:

Limited travel expense reimbursement stipends (partial reimbursement) may be available for individuals who are working on Tribal lands and who attend the entire training event. Travel expense cost will be considered on a case-by-case basis and may be subject to funding restrictions. Travel expenses are reimbursed at the federal government GSA rates. The maximum per diem rate for zip codes <u>85344 in the area of Parker, Arizona</u> for the period of this event is <u>\$107 for lodging</u> and <u>\$59 for meals and incidentals</u>. According to federal guidelines, local residents traveling less than fifty miles one-way are eligible only for mileage reimbursement costs for use of privately-owned automobiles at the rate of <u>\$0.655 per mile</u>.

To request a travel expense reimbursement, please submit an *ITCA Travel Expense Reimbursement Claim Form* within <u>fifteen (15) days</u> following the training event. The travel expense claim form must include the signature of the attendee's supervisor. ITCA will verify an applicant's eligibility based on event attendance records maintained by ITCA staff. This form is available upon request.

A registrant that has received seat confirmation from ITCA may request written verification of ITCA reimbursement funds prior to travel. To do so, please submit a completed *Preliminary Application for Travel Reimbursement Stipend Form* to ITCA before your travel to the event. The form must include the signature of the confirmed registrant's supervisor. This form is available upon request. Preliminary applications received by the deadline will be considered on a first-come first-served basis and will be subject to funding availability. Preliminary applications that are approved by ITCA will receive written notice stating the level of funding available for their travel reimbursement.

PUBLIC HEALTH CONSIDERATIONS:

Protection of public health is a top priority and ITCA intends for the in-person Part 2 of this event to align with federal and local guidelines and recommendations. As of the date of the ITCA event announcement, February 2, 2024, the COVID-19 County Check website of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), indicated the following.
