1. Working with federal, state, tribal, territorial, and local governments, agencies, and organizations to develop or enhance population specific services;
2. Strengthening the capacity of the underserved populations to provide population specific services;
3. Strengthening the capacity of traditional victim service providers to provide population specific services;
4. Strengthening the effectiveness of criminal and civil justice interventions by providing training for law enforcement, prosecutors, judges, and other court personnel on sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking in underserved populations;
5. Working in cooperation with an underserved population to develop and implement outreach, education, prevention, and intervention strategies that highlight available resources and specific issues faced by sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking from underserved populations.
