
Acknowledgements

- We appreciate the ongoing efforts of federal, state, local and tribal health care partners to deliver and administer vaccine to Arizona's most vulnerable populations.
- Vaccine supply remains limited but continues to provide light at the end of the tunnel for the pandemic.
- Public health recommendations to limit disease spread will continue to be crucial until there is demonstrated herd immunity to protect high-risk individuals in our communities.

Important Announcements

- HHS has announced intent to release their entire supply including the federal second dose reserve to increase the supply chain, and state allocations will be pro rata based on the population of adults age 65 and older and vaccines administered by states.
- HHS is urging states to expand vaccination access to people over age 65 and adults under 65 with co-morbidities, and VAPAC has been asked to vote to consider implementing this recommendation for Arizona.
- CDC has notified ADHS to expect \$65 million in federal funding to support efficient statewide vaccination administration.
- Limited amounts of COVID-19 vaccine are now available in all Arizona counties with more info at www.azhealth.gov/findvaccine.

As of January 12th, in Arizona over **165,000** doses have been reported administered out of **456,000** doses received (36% shots used).

Arizona continues to work to rapidly expand vaccination capacity with a wide range of partners.

Summary

- As of January 12th, over 165,000 doses have been reported administered out of 456,000 doses delivered.
- Over 609,925 doses have been ordered and expected to arrive in Arizona by the end of the week, including both first and second doses.
- This week there will be 200+ Phase 1A-1B vaccination sites that have received supplies across
 Arizona, including county health departments, hospitals, FQHCs, pharmacies, and other key providers.
- CVS, Walgreen's, and pharmacy partners are scheduled to provide onsite vaccination clinics at **146** skilled nursing facilities for patients and staff by the end of this week (the CDC Pharmacy Partnership Program for Long-Term Care will provide vaccinations for over **2,000** facilities with vulnerable long-term care residents and staff through spring 2021).
- ADHS is requesting to activate the CDC Retail Pharmacy Program to rapidly expand access to vaccination locations with 100+ retail pharmacy store partners statewide as early as possible.





Arizona Vaccine Distribution While Supplies are Limited

Initial Vaccine Supplies are Limited

- When supplies are limited, a phased vaccination approach will be used to prioritize people by occupation, risk of exposure, and risk of severe outcomes.
- Phase 1B prioritizes high risk populations including age 75+, law enforcement, and teachers initially.
- Additional Phase 1B priority populations will be considered for vaccination as more vaccine supplies become available.

Allocation & Prioritization

 As of January 12th, Arizona has placed orders for 609,925 doses in partnership with local allocators.



• While the supply chain remains constrained, CDC is only releasing a weekly allocation and the state is applying a pro rata allocation based on 1A and 1B priority population estimates.



Vaccine Distribution Overview

- Arizona follows a state-directed local allocator model, which allows an allocation of vaccine to 15 county health departments and 4 tribal entities to distribute to priority groups.
- Advisory committees (ACIP/VAPAC) provide prioritization guidance to ensure fair and equitable allocation.
- Weekly allocation and ordering is expected as more vaccines become available.

Providers interested in receiving a state allocation of COVID-19 vaccine must complete

ADHS Onboarding Tool

Long-term care facilities can sign up for the CDC pharmacy partnership program with Walgreens / CVS (enrollment period closed now)

Some federal entities may receive a direct allocation (e.g. IHS, DOD, etc.) and will enroll directly with CDC Once vaccine receives

Vaccine is allocated to local allocators (counties & tribes that opt-in) to further distribute to priority populations within local jurisdictions

During PHASE 1 Local Allocators determine which sites will get vaccine by submitting Allocation Tool

Later, during PHASE 2
Providers place vaccine
orders directly in ASIIS



ADHS reviews and submits approved orders to the CDC in VTrckS

CDC distributor will direct ship vaccine to providers

Pfizer vaccine will ship in a minimum order of 975 doses per tray requiring cold chain storage at -60 to -80C. Special shipping containers will maintain temp. for ~30 days with dry ice recharge. A second dose to match initial shipment will arrive ~3 weeks later.

McKesson will direct ship ancillary kits (e.g. needles, PPE, etc.) to providers

Kits will contain enough supplies to vaccinate ~100 patients, and will ship in advance of vaccine.

Second Dose Allocation & Ordering


- CDC has been holding a second dose federal reserve to ensure availability of second doses when needed; therefore, second doses have become available for states to place orders the week before they are due (e.g. since Pfizer second dose is due 3 weeks later, second dose ordering opens ~2 weeks after first dose ordering).
- HHS announced yesterday their intent to release all available vaccines, we do not yet know how this will impact state allocations-more details will be coming soon
- During Phase 1, local allocators and provider sites can expect the following:
 - First doses will continue to be allocated pro rata based on population estimates,
 and second doses will be available for ordering as soon as they are available.
 - ADHS plans to open a weekly cycle for ordering in the Allocation Tool for local allocators to order both first and second doses when available.

Expanding VaccinationCapacity

Vaccine Administration Sites

- Initial Phase 1A vaccination sites are open for front line health care and EMS providers
 - 200+ vaccinations sites have been added this week
- CDC Walgreen's/CVS Partnership began vaccinations in skilled nursing facilities the week of Dec 27
 - 2,000+ long-term care facilities signed up for onsite clinics for residents and staff
- Additional statewide sites will be phased in as supplies become available in January-March 2021
 - 730+ providers have onboarded with ADHS and are approved to receive vaccine
 - 800+ pharmacies have enrolled in the CDC Retail
 Pharmacy Program to provide in-store vaccinations


Long-term Care Facilities are Priority

- The <u>CDC Pharmacy Partnership for Long-term</u> <u>Care</u> with Walgreen's/CVS prioritizes providing vaccinations to vulnerable residents and staff.
- **140+** SNFs are scheduled to receive vaccinations by the end of this week.
- Over 2,000 facilities in Arizona enrolled in the federal program, with the goal of covering ~450,000 residents and staff over several months.



24/7 State Farm Stadium POD Concept

- Thank you to partners who worked to rapidly stand up a 24/7 vaccination site with a soft launch of 4,800 appointments in 24 hours
- Over 81,000 appointments have been booked through January 31st
- More appt slots are available for Priority Group 1B and will be opening more times for second doses
- This POD is open to all Arizonans, but was made possible with a pro rata allocation inclusive of Maricopa County Pfizer doses


Register Now





Neighborhood Pharmacy Partners are Key

- CDC has provided a list and map of pharmacy partners that have onboarded through the Federal Retail Pharmacy Program.
- State and local partners have requested to begin allocating vaccine to pharmacy partners through the CDC Retail Pharmacy Program.
- Depending on the supply chain, Arizona plans to start allocating to pharmacy stores in small increments by mid to late January.
- The CDC program does not require individual stores to onboard at the state level to receive vaccines.

V-Safe[™] after vaccination health checker



- V-safe conducts electronic health checkins with vaccine recipients
 - daily for first week post-vaccination; weekly thereafter until 6 weeks post-vaccination
 - additional health checks at 3, 6, and 12 months post-vaccination
 - timeline resets at 2nd dose




Report Adverse Events to VAERS

As per EUA, report after vaccine:

- Any serious event
- Vaccine administration errors
- Multisystem Inflammatory Syndrome
- Hospitalization or death from COVID-19



How to Become a Vaccinator

- Provider sites must complete <u>ADHS Onboarding Tool</u> to be approved and eligible to receive vaccine
- Individual volunteers can register at <u>ESAR-VHP</u>
- Who can administer COVID-19 vaccine?
 Healthcare providers who are authorized to administer vaccines are medical doctors (M.D.), osteopathic physicians (D.O.), physician assistants, nurse practitioners, registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, medical assistants, emergency medical technicians (EMT-I), paramedics, school nurses, and pharmacists. The scope of practice of various professions and occupations can be found in A.R.S. Title 32.

Emergency System for Advance Registration of Volunteer Health Professionals (ESAR-VHP)

What do you need to know as a volunteer?



VHAT IS ESAR-VHP?

ESAR-WHIP is a secure online public health emergency preparedness registry for ALL Arizona healthcare professionals. This registry system enables hospitals and other medical entities to meetcrisis and surge capacity needs as well as ensure the continuance of critical health care services for



WHERE DO I SIGN UP?

Volunteers can register in the system at www.audha.gov/volunteer. The registry is open to all medical and non-medical personnel, if applicable, you will need to provide information regarding your regarding your register of the provide information regarding to the group of interest, such as O'000-99. One registered in the system you will be on a contact list for future opportunities. If you want to improve visibility of your interest, you can also join a Medical Reserve Corps (MGC or community it mergency Response Team (CRRI I) your local area.



WHAT MISSIONS CAN I CONSIDER?

You can choose in your ESAR-VHP Profile about the length and distance you are willing to travel. All missions are voluntary. If notified of a mission, you will not be required to go. Remember to update your profile with the latest contact and license information to help with the volunteer matching



HOW WILL I BE NOTIFIED?

You will receive a notification by the enail or phone number on file from a requesting entity, such as a hospital that is interested in your skill set. You will then be given the option to accept or decline that request. The requesting entity will describe if the opportunity provides wages, meals, lodging, transportation or travel reimbursement.



WHERE DO LGO


Upon accepting a mission request from an entity, you will be deployed to a staging area for just in time training. The requesting entity will also provide details which may include adiety procedure at the facility and logistics information on group transport to a facility. If unsure of any of the following parameters, contact your field supervisor regarding any issues or questions.



MY VOLUNTEER MISSION IS OVER, WHAT DO I DO NOW

Sign-out with your field supervisor and await instructions for transportation to the staging area or approval that all forms are signed that you can travel home.

Next Steps



- Continue to partner and coordinate with county health departments and tribal entities on statewide vaccination efforts
- Focus on high level strategies to expand vaccination capacity, including retail pharmacies and high-throughput drive-thru sites for priority populations
- State and local allocators remain committed to serving long-term care (counties have launched additional strike teams in partnership with pharmacies)
- ADHS and local partners have started launching Phase 1B information, including VaccineFinder map, hotline, and FAQs on "How can I get vaccinated?"
- The supply chain remains constrained nationwide and there will <u>not</u> be enough vaccine for everyone this month, but we are hopeful that more vaccine is on its way soon!
