Join Arizona's Maternal Mortality Review AI/AN Subcommittee

SCOPE

To conduct a holistic review of all identified deaths of AI/AN persons that occur during pregnancy or within one year after pregnancy ends. This includes deaths in Arizona and deaths of Arizona residents that happen in other states. The review will examine all causes of death.

MISSION

To respect tribal sovereignty, honor lived experiences, and integrate traditional knowledge by providing culturally-rooted, community centered recommendations that address maternal health disparities impacting AI/AN persons to public health and health care systems in Arizona.

VISION

Cultivating a future where AI/AN maternal and family health and wellbeing thrive by promoting culturally-affirming, long-term, sustainable solutions.
