THE TRAINING COURSE:

The Inter Tribal Council of Arizona, Inc. (ITCA) is pleased to offer the **Water Treatment - Level 1** training course. The course offers over 48 hours of training and is designed to enhance the skills and knowledge of Tribal drinking water treatment facility operators. Subjects covered in this training course will include: water sources and quality, treatment processes, disinfection, laboratory analysis, worker safety, math, the Safe Drinking Act, and more. Training reference materials will be mailed to registrants that are accepted into this course.

ITCA does NOT "teach to the certification exams." Students intending to take operator certification exams during this training course are encouraged to study the need-to-know criteria and recommended study guide references associated with the certification exams. Optional certification exams will be offered for free during the second part of this training course. Attendees that are only interested in the training may choose not to take the certification exams.

Cost

Tribal water utilities personnel may attend this training course for **free**.

INSTRUCTOR:

ITCA has contracted with subject-matter expert Nicole Mangin, of MEC TECH Services, Inc., to instruct this training course. Nicole Mangin has extensive experience in the operation and maintenance of drinking water treatment systems in Indian Country.

The following two (2) certification exam sessions will take place during the in-person Part 2 of the training event for those interested in earning the Water Treatment-Level 1 Operator Certification through the ITCA National Tribal Water & Wastewater Operator Certification Program. Please be advised that prior approval from ITCA is required for admission into the exam sessions. There will be no late admission into the exam session.

- Exam Session A—On Tuesday, October 7, 2025, starting promptly at 2:00 p.m. and concluding at or before 5:00 p.m., the Federal Regulations Exam Module for Drinking Water Treatment Operator Certification will be administered to eligible Tribal water utilities personnel. This will be an open-book exam using only content approved by ITCA.
- Exam Session B—On Friday, October 10, 2025, starting promptly at 1:00 p.m. and concluding at or before 5:00 p.m., the Standardized ABC/WPI Exam (current edition) for Water Treatment Level 1 operator certification will be administered to interested and eligible Tribal water utilities personnel. This will be a closed-book exam.

ATTENDANCE & CONTACT HOURS:

Attendees that complete the course requirements will receive written recognition of earned training contact hours based on class participation, homework assignments, and attendance. Training contact hours may be accepted towards the training requirements for new certification or as Professional Development Hour (PDH) / continuing education credit towards the renewal of existing certification. Confirmed registrants that are interested in only earning training contact hours may attend as many of the class sessions as needed.

Training course size is limited. Registrants that are accepted into the training course will receive written confirmation of a reserved seat. Please Note: a reserved seat does not apply to the exam sessions. Separate written approval is required to be admitted into the certification exam sessions (see Exam & Certification section below).

ITCA PROGRAM OBJECTIVE:

The National Tribal Water and Wastewater Operator Certification Program at ITCA serves to meet the needs of system operators working on Tribal lands and to provide a <u>jurisdictionally correct</u> <u>alternative to state certification programs</u>. The ITCA is a U.S. EPA-approved provider of certification services under the U.S. EPA Tribal Drinking Water Operator Certification Program Guidelines and makes its services available to all Tribal water and wastewater utilities personnel working in Indian Country. ITCA-issued certification in drinking water or wastewater is deemed equivalent and accepted through reciprocity (exam waiver) by numerous states. <u>Tribal operator certification is an additional way by which Tribal governments can exercise their sovereignty and promote their self-determination goals.</u>

EXAMINATION & CERTIFICATION: Exam Application Deadline is October 6, 2025

Water utilities personnel operating systems located on federal trust Tribal lands (Indian reservations) may apply for ITCA operator certification and take the operator certification exams

for free. ITCA staff will be available during the in-person Part 2 of the training event to proctor paper-booklet certification exams (both the Federal Regulations Exam Module and the ABC/WPI Standardized Exam) to eligible Tribal utilities personnel seeking Water Treatment – Level 1 Operator Certification. Participants must have prior written approval from ITCA to be admitted into the examination sessions. Approval is based upon submittal of a complete ITCA Application for New (Drinking Water) Certification by close of business on **Monday**, **October 6**, **2025**. Please refer to the ITCA Application Booklet for complete certification eligibility criteria and the application, which is available on the ITCA website or by directly contacting the ITCA Tribal Water Systems Department. You are highly encouraged to submit a complete application as soon as possible.

Important Notice: ITCA drinking water operator certification requires two exams—the FedReg Exam Module AND the Standardized Exam. The FedReg exam has been uniquely developed to utilize an "open book" format. ITCA will make available to each student an electronic tablet containing the federal regulations reference documents pre-loaded for examinees to look up as they are taking the Federal Regulations exam. This course provides students with practice in using these tablets.

Students intending to take the certification exams are encouraged to study the following need-to-know criteria, which include lists of recommended study references.

TRAVEL EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT:

Limited travel expense reimbursement funding is available for individuals who are working on Tribal lands and who attend the training event. Travel expense cost will be considered for reimbursement on a case-by-case basis and may be subject to funding restrictions. Travel expenses are reimbursed at the federal government GSA rates. The maximum per diem rate for zip code 97232 in the area of Portland, Oregon for the time period of the in-person Part 2 of this event is \$155 for lodging and \$86 for meals and incidentals. According to federal guidelines, local residents traveling less than fifty miles one-way are eligible only for mileage reimbursement costs for use of privately-owned automobiles at the rate of \$0.70 per mile.

To request a travel expense reimbursement, please submit an *ITCA Travel Expense Reimbursement Claim Form* within <u>fifteen (15) days</u> following the training event. This form is available upon request. The travel expense claim form must include the signature of the attendee's

supervisor. ITCA will verify an applicant's eligibility based on event attendance records maintained by ITCA.

A registrant that has received seat confirmation from ITCA may request written verification of ITCA reimbursement funds prior to travel. To do so, please submit a completed *Preliminary Application for Travel Reimbursement Stipend Form* to ITCA before your travel to the event. This form is available upon request. The form must include the signature of the confirmed registrant's supervisor. Preliminary applications received prior to the start of the in-person Part 2 of the course will be considered on a first-come first-served basis and will be subject to funding availability. Preliminary applications that are approved by ITCA will receive written notice stating the level of funding available for their travel reimbursement.

PUBLIC HEALTH CONSIDERATIONS:

Protection of public health is a top priority and ITCA intends for the in-person Part 2 of this event to align with federal and local guidelines and recommendations. This training event is available for personnel working on Tribal lands located throughout the country. Therefore, some of the attendees, the instructor / speakers, and facilitators will travel from various other locations to attend the in-person Part 2 of the event, which will take place indoors within meeting rooms. Attendees will be encouraged to sit in an every-other seat pattern for social distancing and for exam proctoring best practices. Individuals are free to choose whether to wear a facemask, including during the exam sessions.
